

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is written on behalf of I.C. and using his services to convince our daughter to break her negative influences and agree to attend a recovery program.

She had spiraled after a difficult period in her life. She went from being a good student about to graduate from college to associating and living with known gang members and abusing hard drugs. Her drug use was so debilitating she could not think logically and began to lie and steal to get what she wanted, with no concern on the effects on others.

We decided to get her into a rehab situation, but her involvement with drugs and gangs made it almost impossible to get her to a safe environment. We decided to ask I.C. to help us get her to rehab. Our daughter was warned about the intervention by a family member out to sabotage the intervention and appear to be helping her. I.C. had an off-duty police officer stationed outside her apartment, but she had left her apartment for a hotel in a neighboring city to avoid the intervention. I.C. was able to find out where she was staying and sent the off-duty police officer to watch the hotel room. Our family and I.C. left our communities for the three and a half hour drive to the hotel for the intervention. Our daughter was to be out of the hotel room by 2:00 pm. By chance she approached the off-duty police officer for assistance. He was able to convince her to stay at the hotel and even paid for her room and bought her some food. I.C. wanted to keep her at the hotel by herself. During our drive to the intervention we received a call from I.C. that the off-duty police officer spotted gang members with guns go into her hotel room. We checked into a hotel and waited for a call that she was alone in the hotel room. Instead, she left with them and unable to follow their car I.C. called off the intervention for the day.

The next day we located her at the court house to attend the arraignment of her boyfriend who had been arrested two days earlier on possession with the intent to sell drugs. The family member who had told her of the intervention had taken her to the court house. Her boyfriend's arraignment had been rescheduled for later in the day and she went back to the hotel room. I.C. suggested that we hold the intervention at the hotel. I.C. convinced the family member who had initially sabotaged the intervention to participate. We entered her hotel room and found her with a friend shooting up heroin. She was angry and deviant about the intervention. She and her friend packed up the friend's car with their belongings. The off-duty police officer "convinced" the friend to leave immediately and without our daughter. I.C. guided the rest of us to continue with the intervention. She stormed out intent to get back to the court house before her boyfriend's rescheduled arraignment. The off-duty police officer and I.C. followed our daughter who was hitchhiking. She was quickly picked and driven to the court house. I.C. followed her, as we cleaned up the used syringes and drug paraphernalia from the hotel room.

Three hours later, she left the court house and after I.C.'s encouragement we approached her again with the offer of going to rehab that evening or no more contact with her family. She refused and we left her as night was coming with no car, no money and miles away from her apartment. Her boyfriend was in jail and her friend had driven away. A couple hours later she sent me the text message "I will go".

Without I.C.'s guidance, encouragement and perseverance our daughter would not have gone to recovery. He even escorted her safely across the country to a recovery center.
